Expanding from a biannual publication to a highly anticipated 5x/year title, Cultured counts Louis Vuitton, Cartier, Dior, Celine and Hermes among its advertisers and has partnered with several luxury brands on exclusive events, including the Harry Winston & Cultured Magazine Annual Art Basel Kick-Off Dinner. Harrelson serves as the Editor-in-chief and publisher of Bal Harbour Magazine, Editorial Director of Fort Lauderdale's Venice Magazine, and Contributing Editor at Architectural Digest. As co-founder of Whitehaus Media Group, she has also published several art books for various galleries along with architecture-driven custom content. Harrelson serves on the Board of The Bass Museum and the committee for Breakthrough Miami. She recently served as a juror for final review for students in Columbia University's Graduate School of Architecture, Planning and Preservation. She currently lives in Miami Beach with her husband, designer Austin Harrelson, and their three children (ages 17, 14 and 12).

Lyon has exhibited extensively both nationally and internationally.
