Aspen/Snowmass, CO (April 19, 2018) — Anderson Ranch Arts Center, a premier art-making destination and a catalyst for critical dialog in the contemporary art world, announces this year's Summer Series: Featured Artists & Conversations with acclaimed artists Ai Weiwei, Njideka Akunyili Crosby, Tara Donovan, Robert Longo and Vik Muniz. The series will present these artists in conversation with top art world professionals from across the country including Nora Burnett Abrams, Alexandra Munroe, Naomi Beckwith and Renaud Proch. The Summer Series will also feature Service to the Arts Award Honorees Bunny and Charles Burson in conversation with Edward Felsenthal, Editor in Chief of TIME Magazine.

In addition, L.A.-based multi-media artist **Alex Israel** will be the featured speaker for the **2018 National Council Summer Celebration** on Friday, July 27.

"Our commitment to stimulating creative dialog focused on contemporary art and art-making is at the heart of our Summer Series program," said Nancy Wilhelms, Executive Director of Anderson Ranch. "This year's lineup of Featured Artists and Conversations is testament to that commitment. We continue to invite artists and art world influencers to the Ranch to engage in conversation with the community as part of our mission. We're so looking forward to hosting the series this summer."

The annual series features some of the most influential artists of our time, explores the work of world-renowned creators and curators, and hosts conversations with today's most significant critics and collectors in both lecture and Q&A formats. Past artist participants have included Doug Aitken (2017), The Haas Brothers (2016), Frank Stella (2015), Theaster Gates (2014) and Marina Abramovi (2013).

The **Summer Series** is supported by Toby Devan Lewis and the Ranch's National Council Sponsors. It is part of a full slate of creative public programming at Anderson Ranch throughout the year, including the Ranch's **Critical Dialog** programs, generously supported by Paula and Jim Crown. #### 2018 Critical Dialog

The first program on June 14, "Makin' It", is an exploration of working artists. The term "starving artist" isn't just a myth— most successful artists have struggled with financial hardship, balancing their studio practice with multiple jobs and student loan debts in their quest to follow their dreams. This exciting program will reveal one artist's unique pathway to a successful and meaningful art career. In conversation with Artistic Director Elizabeth Ferrill, artist Esteban del Valle will share his experiences from his youth as an art student, to finding gallery representation and supporting himself as an artist. He will provide insights into becoming a vital participant in the contemporary art world.

July 9-10, Anderson Ranch will present its second Critical Dialog, "Rebels in Paradise"; a discussion and interactive activity centered on the art scene in 1960's Los Angeles. The conversation will examine how a creative community operated outside the pressures of New York City that included artists like Ed Ruscha, David Hockney, Bruce Nauman, Judy Chicago, Robert Irwin and John Baldessari. This workshop examines an era in Southern California that cultivated the thriving cultural scene of today, focusing on icons like Andy Warhol, Frank Gehry, the Beach Boys and Dennis Hopper. It also explores the use of collage and assemblage as alternatives to traditional painting or sculpture by looking at African American artists such as Noah Purifoy and female artists like Alexis Smith and Betye Saar. Led by KCRW's Hunter Drohojowska-Philp and Chair of the MFA

Fine Arts Program at the Otis College of Art and Design, **Roy Dowell**, the program explores L.A.'s unique history and the ways in which its artists produced their work.
