RYOJI IKEDA'S *DATA-VERSE 3* (2021) OPENS AT UNLIMITED, ART BASEL

20 September 2021 – Ryoji Ikeda's *data-verse 3* (2021) premiered today as a standalone artwork as part of Art Basel's Unlimited sector, the unique platform for large-scale projects that transcend the limitations of a traditional art-fair stand. Presented by Almine Rech and commissioned by Audemars Piguet Contemporary, the third and final variation of the artist's most complex project to date marks the conclusive chapter in his data-driven audio-visual research into nature that first began in the early 2000s.

Ryoji Ikeda is an electronic composer and visual artist who explores sound and light by means of mathematical precision and aesthetics. By experimenting with frequencies and scales difficult for the human ear and mind alone to comprehend, Ikeda renders the imperceptible through numerical systems and computer aesthetics. His long-term projects have taken a multiplicity of forms, from immersive live performances and audio-visual installations to books and CDs and have evolved over the years to encompass his data-driven research.

Ikeda considers the *data-verse* trilogy to be his ultimate project. The perfectly synchronised composition follows two decades of research and execution, during which the artist and his team rigorously processed, transcribed and transformed open-source scientific data from institutions including CERN, NASA and the Human Genome Project. The complete trilogy was commissioned by Audemars Piguet Contemporary in 2015 and consists of three state-of-the-art high definition DCI-4K video projections accompanied by a minimalist electronic soundtrack, *data-verse* is Ikeda's own hypnotic manifestation of the various dimensions of our world and immerses visitors in a cosmic journey from the microscopic to the human to the macroscopic.

data-verse 1 premiered at the 58th International Art Exhibition, La Biennale de Venezia (11 May – 24 November 2019). data-verse 1 and 2 were exhibited at Kunstmuseum Wolfsburg (7 December 2019 – 29 March 2020). The complete trilogy was exhibited at the centrepiece of *RYOJI IKEDA*, the largest exhibition of works by the artist to date in Europe, at 180 Studios in London curated and produced by The Vinyl Factory and Fact Magazine in collaboration with Audemars Piguet Contemporary (20 May – 18 September 2021).

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About Ryoji Ikeda

Leading composer and visual artist Ryoji Ikeda explores the essential characteristics of sound and light by means of mathematical precision and aesthetics. By orchestrating sounds, visuals, materials, physics and mathematics, Ikeda goes beyond the conceptual to delve into extremes and infinites, testing the limits of human senses and digital technology. Ikeda's experimental work engages with frequencies and scales difficult for the human ear and mind to comprehend, visualising sounds and rendering the imperceptible through numerical systems and computer aesthetics. His long-term projects have taken a multiplicity of forms, from immersive live performances and audio-visual installations to books and CDs. They have evolved over the years to encompass the latest iterations of his data-driven research.

Ryoji Ikeda's work has been performed and exhibited in numerous venues worldwide, such as the Museum of Contemporary Art in Tokyo, the Elektra Festival, DHC Art Foundation and Musée d'Art Contemporain (MAC) in Montreal, the Festival Grec and the Sonár in Barcelona, the Barbican Centre and The Vinyl Factory in London, the Carriageworks in Sydney, the MONA in Hobart, the

Ruhrtriennale in Germany, the Kyoto Experiment, the ACT Centre in Gwangju, the Singapore Art Science Museum, the Kunstverein in Hannover, the Pompidou Centre in Paris and Metz, the ZKM Centre for Art and Media in Karlsruhe, the Garage Museum of Contemporary Art in Moscow, Eye Film Museum Amsterdam and Onassis Cultural Centre in Athens, among others. Ikeda is the recipient of the 2001 Ars Electronica's Golden Nica Prize for the Digital Music Category, the 2012 Giga-Hertz Award in the category of Sound Art at ZKM in Germany and the 2014 Prix Ars Electronica Collide@CERN.

About Almine Rech

Almine Rech opened its doors on April 1, 1997 in the 13th arrondissement in Paris. The gallery was founded on an axis of California Minimal, Perceptual art and Conceptual art. In addition to its stable of internationally recognised, mid-career and emerging artists, it has always been the gallery's mission to continually seek out and include new artists in its programme, opening especially to painters. The gallery has held longstanding relationships with artists like Joseph Kosuth, John McCracken and James Turrell and has since started working with and representing artists such as Alex Israel and De Wain Valentine, Jeff Koons and the painters Antoni Tàpies, Karel Appel, Nathaniel Mary Quinn, Vaughn Spann and Claire Tabouret, among others. The gallery opened at 27 Hugiu Road on July 12, 2019 with a group show titled "Approaches to Abstraction" featuring a selection of artists from the gallery's roster, including John M Armleder, Sylvie Fleury, and Guinther Forg in conjunction with an exhibition curated by the gallery at Song Art Museum, Beijing. In January 2021, Almine Rech opened a second space in Paris, avenue Matignon in the 8th district, with a solo show by iconic US artist Kenny Scharf.
